


OVERVIEW

- The Phase 1A Site is 3.5-acres of a 32.63-acre Master Plan being developed for the Joint Public Safety Training Campus at the 4300 block of Chicago Avenue.
- The Phase 1A project is intended to create programmatic connections between the
 Academy Building, Outdoor Tactical and Fire Training Facilities, Boys and Girls Club
 of Chicago (BGCC) and the broader neighborhood. Ongoing community engagement
 has been a critical part of the process and has included residents, students, Chicago
 Police and Fire Departments and Boys and Girls Club members.
- Phases 1 and 2 as well as the Phase 1A BGCC are being developed and delivered under separate contracts.
- The scope for the Phase 1A Outlot Restaurants project includes:
 - Core and shell and the interior buildout of two (2) single-story restaurant tenants
 - Site remediation
 - Public Right of Way (PROW) improvements
 - Site development (parking, drive through, public plazas, landscaping, site lighting, etc.)
 - Addressing DPD's Design Excellence Guidelines and Sustainability Goals
- The Phase 1A Outlot Area has been enrolled into the IEPA's Site Remediation Program.

Compliance - Certification



- PBC ensures that only certified and experienced firms perform the required services.
- MBE or WBE firms must be certified with the City of Chicago and/or Cook County to receive credit as an MBE/WBE firm by the PBC.

Compliance – City Residency & Community Hiring

- ☑ City Residency Requirement: at least 50% of the total construction hours worked on project must be worked by City of Chicago residents
- ✓ Community Hiring goal: at least 15% of the total construction hours worked on project must come from Community Area residents. PBC encourages the creation of career opportunities for residents of a project's surrounding community areas, both in the construction trades, as well as skilled and unskilled workers.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ)

How will I know if my application has been processed?

After you submit a completed interest form, you will receive a confirmation of receipt. Your interest form will be processed by the PBC and included in the community hiring database.

Will the PBC be hiring for any projects?

No, the General Contractor (GC)/Construction Manager (CM)/Design-Builder (DB) will conduct the actual hiring. The PBC does not endorse or promote any candidate for employment or potential employer. The PBC does not quarantee any employment whatsoever to the Applicant.

What kinds of jobs are available through this Project?

The GC/CM/DB is looking for skilled trade workers (ie... electricians, plumbers, etc.) and nonconstruction related staff (ie.. document control, clerical, etc).

Do I have to have construction experience to apply?

No, the GC/CM/DB is looking for skilled trade workers (ie... electricians, plumbers, etc.) and nonconstruction related staff (ie.. document control, clerical, etc).

Do I have to be in a union to apply?

No, the GC/CM/DB is looking for skilled trade workers (ie... electricians, plumbers, etc.) and non-construction related staff (ie.. document control, clerical, etc). However, for skilled tradespersons, the GC/CM/DB is governed by a PLA (Project Labor Agreement) therefore, the GC/CM/DB must abide by the provisions outlined in the PLA.

Are these permanent positions?

No, these positions are temporary for work solely related to the construction work on particular projects.

If I know someone who wants to apply, what should I tell them?

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FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ CON'T)

Do I have to live in a community area to apply?

The PBC is committed to having residents who live in the community work on the projects being built or renovated in their community. The PBC has contract provisions that require at least 50% of the labor force be local (Chicago) residents. Additionally, the GC is required to hire 7.5% of the total hours worked to community area residents.

How will I know if I have a job?

If your interest form meets the GC/CM/DB's requirements, you will be contacted by the GC for a potential interview and possible placement.

If I am an apprentice or journeyman, may I apply?

Yes, apprentices and journeyworkers are encouraged to apply. The PBC has contract provisions that require a percentage of the labor force to be minority journeyworkers, minority apprentices, and minority laborers. Additionally, the PBC has contract provisions that require a percentage of the labor force to be female journeyworkers, female apprentices, and female laborers.
